Milk Oolong

Lovers Leap Estate – Nuwara Eliya, Ceylon

The estate gets its name from two lovers who leapt to their fate. Famous for being the only tea that was served at the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. Best enjoyed on its own, or with a slice of lemon.

Okayti Estate – 1st Flush Darjeeling, India

Grown on the misty slopes of India's world famous Darjeeling region. The estate gets its name from the nick name given by London Tea traders who described it as the only "Okay Tea" from the region.
